



Rules and Regulations

Judging Rules:

- Judges are not allowed to score their own submitted project.
- Judges will not be allowed to score any project their company worked on any part of.
- Projects are to remain anonymous during judging. If you recognize a project and its specific designer, please ask to be reassigned.

Submittals:

- Each project is submitted as a series of pictures and narratives:
 - Up to 10 pictures can be submitted per project, each with a corresponding text allowance.
 - It is not necessary to upload the maximum of 10 photographs.
 - Please include a general narrative, not to exceed 1200 characters, which will be read during the awards presentation if the project receives a Brilliance Award.
 - There is a 500 character limit to each photograph's accompanying text. It is not necessary to be wordy in descriptions if other photographs and text address the point.
 - The narrative and additional text descriptions should cumulatively address all scoring criteria. No one text box needs to address any certain amount of criteria, it is simply recommended that all criteria be addressed at some point in the project submission.
- No submittals will be accepted late.
- The project must be designed by a Rocky Mountain based lighting team (In the Rocky Mountain Region).
- Project must have been built (finished construction) within the last 3 years. Any projects completed in January of 2019 or later will qualify.
- All images must be real, doctored or light filled images will not be accepted. If an image appears to be doctored, the Brilliance Awards will not include it for judging.
- Submitting the same project in the same category from different individuals is not allowed.
- It is allowed to submit the same project to different categories, provided they fit in that category.
- Credit for the architectural design must be given as well as credit to the design team.

- Any falsified information renders submittals void.
- The Brilliance Awards reserves the right to remove applications from judging contention. The Brilliance Awards judging committee has the final decision on the qualifications of judging applicants.
- Any project submitted for judging to the Brilliance Awards could be used in marketing materials. Winning project images will be used in marketing materials.
- The Brilliance Awards is not liable to keep project submittals past the corresponding award ceremony, nor is it responsible for any missed information or falsified information in submissions; be it judging, award, or sponsorship.
